MINUTE entry before the Honorable Edmond E. Chang: On review of the Status Report, as well as the decision in the Perry Capital LLC v. Lew, 70 F. Supp.2d 208 (D.D.C. 2014), it appears that FHFA and Treasury likely will present some overlapping arguments in their dismissal motions. Accordingly, the Court sets the following motions plan and briefing schedule. First, all Defendants shall file a single joint motion to dismiss by 07/13/2016 (an extra week is given to account for this change in plan). On that same date, the Defendants shall file: (1) a combined brief that presents their overlapping arguments, not to exceed 25 pages; and (2) individual briefs presenting their individual arguments, not to exceed 25 pages. (Think of this as the same type of briefing plan in an appeal with multiple appellants/appellees, who routinely file a joint brief and individual briefs.) By 08/12/2016, Plaintiffs shall file a combined response brief addressing all issues, not to exceed 65 pages. By 09/14/2016, Defendants shall file a combined reply brief by working together; the reply will have an argument section on the common issues and individual–argument sections. The reply may consume 40 pages. If the parties truly need more pages than set forth in this order, they may file motions for more pages as they get closer to finishing them.
