UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR AN 8-DAY EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE RESPONSE BRIEFS

brief be extended, as well. In support of this motion, Treasury states the following:

1. This case challenges actions taken by Treasury and the Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) with respect to the operation of the conservatorships of the Federal National Mortgage Association (Fannie Mae) and the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation (Freddie Mac). The district court granted defendants' motions to dismiss plaintiffs' claims. Plaintiffs filed their opening brief on September 4, 2018.

Defendants previously requested, and received, one 30-day extension of time in which to file their response briefs. Those briefs are currently due November 5, 2018.

- 2. This case raises multiple constitutional questions that require coordination between Treasury and the Department of Justice. An additional short extension is necessary to permit Treasury time to complete its consultation with various components of the Department of Justice. In light of the necessary extension for Treasury's brief, Treasury also respectfully requests that the time for filing FHFA's brief be extended, as well.
- 3. Counsel for Treasury has contacted Brian Barnes, counsel for appellants, who indicated that appellants do not oppose our request.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, the time for filing appellees' briefs should be extended by 8 days, to and including November 13, 2018.
